Established in 2003, Maas Foundation boasts 20 years of experience in the realms of national and international theatre, having delivered over a hundred performances across various countries such as Pakistan, Sri Lanka, China, South Korea, India, Turkmenistan and United Arab Emirates. Notably, it stands out as the sole theatre organization in Pakistan to have showcased theatre performances in multiple languages including Urdu, English, Punjabi, and nonverbal.

Celebrating its two-decade journey, Maas Foundation embarked on a significant endeavor to organize and host an international theatre festival in Lahore. This grand event promised a fusion of culture, art, and collaborative theatre from around the globe, marking a pivotal moment for the organization and the theatre world in Pakistan.

Introduction to Maas International Theatre Festival 2024 (#MITF24)

Theatre is one of the oldest art forms in the world and the Lahore audience had been deprived of international theatre performances since 2008. Keeping this in mind, Maas Foundation took on this challenge to bring together theatre artists from all over the world to perform at the 1st Maas International Theatre Festival 2024. This festival comprised of theatre performances, panel discussions & workshops for both adults and children.

Driven by a deep passion and love for theatre, the Maas festival team envisioned to spread this 4 day colorful festival across the city of Lahore at various locations which included, Alhamra Cultural Complex, University of Central Punjab, The City School Bahria Campus, The City School Ravi Campus and The City School Paragon Campus.

Renowned as the cultural heart of Pakistan, Lahore witnessed the revival of international theatre after 16 years—a significant achievement made possible through the dedicated efforts of our partners, supporters, audiences, and talented artists from across the globe. Together, our international artists and national teams worked in collaboration to present enthralling performances, reinvigorating the theatre scene in the city.

A Rendezvous of Culture and Collaboration

This festival brought together a diverse mix of performances for all age groups from theatre artists from England, Estonia, France, Mongolia, Wales and the host country Pakistan. This festival was also a beautiful hub for cultural exchange and collaboration between artists as they learnt about theatre practices from each other. This rich exchange of ideas and collaboration between teams from different countries makes it the most unique event in Pakistan. Festival also featured Panel discussions with famous performing arts personalities of Pakistan, educationists & thinkers along with vibrant theatre workshops by international theatre facilitators specially designed for kids and young theatre practitioners.

Day 2

The day began with a theatre show for Early Years Students titled "Where the Leaves Blow" by Arad Goch from Wales, United Kingdom at The City School Ravi Campus. This was followed by a workshop at the University of Central Punjab by Mayra Stergiou from Vertebra Theatre, England and Muneeb ur Rehman from Pakistan titled Inner Landscapes: Creating with Improvised the Body. The evening performances featured two powerful monodramas - "The Fugitive" by R.A.A.A.M from Estonia, a story about the thirst for freedom, and the critically acclaimed masterpiece "King of Nothing" from Maas Foundation. 






Day 3
